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Scholarship Terms and Conditions

- **Eligibility:** Alaska Chapter 99s, Mat-Su Valley Chapter 99s, and the Joyce Penman Memorial scholarships are open to female Alaska residents over 16 years of age. Applicants may use the award toward her Private license (after solo) or Advanced Rating/Endorsement; Mat-Su Valley residents will be given preference for their award, if there are no eligible applicants from the “Valley” then other applicants will be considered.

Applicants for the Private Pilot student scholarships must have already soloed.

Applicants may apply for more than one scholarship, but a separate application must be enclosed for each award sought.

- The scholarship winner must agree to complete the goal for which the scholarship will be used within 18 calendar months of award. The Scholarship money will be sent to the recipient’s flight school, instructor or the recipient, at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee. If for some reason the scholarship money is not used, it will be returned to the awarding 99s chapter.
- The Alaska Chapter scholarship winner is required either to attend a 99s meeting to report on the progress toward her goal, or to submit a written report if unable to attend within the 18 month allotted timeframe. The Mat-Su Valley award winner must provide monthly updates on her progress via email, phone call or meeting attendance.
- Scholarships will be announced at the 2019 Great Alaskan Aviation Gathering and 2019 Alaska Chapter May meeting; meetings are the second Wednesday of the month.
